

- 2. No entries will be accepted after 11 a.m. Friday.
- 3. Entries must be the property/work of the exhibitor unless otherwise stated (Heritage classes).
- 4. Previous prize winning exhibits of the bench show are not to be re entered.
- 5. Entry tags must show section number, class number, letter designation, phone number, age division & grade (where applicable) as outlined in this Bench Show catalogue.
- 6. No new classes will be created during the Bench Show.
- 7. "Display Only" classes are for those exhibits not covered by the classes outlined in the catalogue. Items will not be judged.
- 8. Only one entry per person, per class.
- 9. If the article is not for competition, please state "For Display Only" on exhibitor's tag. (no charge)
- 10. Entries must be picked up at 4 p.m. Saturday. Any entries left will be disposed of.
- 11. Information & booklets on judging standards are available from Alberta Agriculture.
- 12. No prices are to be advertised & displays are not to be sold at the bench show
- 13. If you wish to donate your food exhibit for sale, please indicate it on the tag.
- 14. No exhibitor, with the exception of the judges, directors of the section, or members of the executive, may be present while judging is in progress.
- 15. All exhibitors agree to abide by the rules & regulations printed herein or afterwards as stated by the Claresholm & District Fair Board. NOTE: Metric Conversion 1" = 2.5 cm.
- 16. Tags will be available by June 1st onward at the Claresholm Local Press & mid-July at the Farmer's Market.
- Junior categories are listed as 17 years & under or defined by age. Divisions defined by age are as follows:
 Division A: 5 & Under
 Division B: 6 & 7
 - Division C: 8 & 9
 - Division D: 10 & 11
 - Division E: 12 & 13
 - Division F: 14 to 17

NOTE: Junior entries must state the exhibitor's age as of August 1 of the current year.

- 18. Adult categories are for exhibitors over the age of 18 years.
- 19. All names & identifying features must be covered before item is judged.
- 20. An individual's entry to multiple classes must use the same name given at registration.

- The bench show is open to the public Friday from 6 9 p.m. & Saturday from 12 noon 4 p.m.
- Selling time for donated items is 3 p.m. Saturday.
- Prize money payout begins at 4 p.m. Saturday. Items must be left until 4 p.m. Saturday. .

JUDGING

- 1. Prizes will be awarded at the discretion of the judges.
- 2. Judging of Sections 6 & 7 will be done by the Alberta Horticultural Association accredited judges.

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

- (c) Sheaf ties top band: 2.5 cm below the bottom of heads bottom band: 2.5 cm above the bottom of stem
 centre band: evenly spaced between the top & bottom bands
 - band ties to be uniform size
- (d) Name variety on entry tags

SECTION 6 • FLOWERS & PLANTS cont.

Guidelines:

- (a) Individual blooms of flowers such as marigold & calendula are shown with only one open bloom per stem. If an extra bud is present, it must be in the "tight bud" condition so that it will not show colour at the bench show
- (b) With flowers that have multiple blooms, such as sweet peas, stocks or phlox, the more blooms that are open, the better the exhibit
- (c) In some cultural classes, for example, petunia, begonia & pansy, the flower alone is judged; stem & foliage are not considered
- (d) Shallow containers allowing individual placement of the flowers should be used
- (e) Flower varieties should be named if possible
- (f) If a "vase" is indicated, a plastic container, such as a pail, is not a vase
- (g) No commercial elements are to be used in an arrangement
- (h) Please note the number of blooms/stems required for each class
- (i) A bouquet is NOT an arrangement. You collect flowers in hand & drop into a vase; do not arrange.

- 7. Dahlia, any type or colour, 1 bloom
- 8. Daisy, Shasta, 3 stems
- 9. Delphinium, any colour, 1 stem
- 10. Dianthus (pinks), 3 stems
- 11. Gladiolus, any type or colour, 1 spike
- 12. Gladiolus, any type or colour, 3 spikes
- 13. Lily, any type or colour, 1 stem
- 14. Marigold, 4 to 8 cm, 5 blooms
- 15. Marigold, over 8 cm, 5 blooms
- 16. Marigold, under 4 cm, 5 blooms
- 17. Nasturtiums, 5 stems
- 18. Pansy, any colour, 5 blooms
- 19. Pansy, one colour, 5 blooms,
- 20. Petunias, double, 5 blooms

- 1. Bouquet of flowers & grasses (tame or wild; may include seeds, berries, no weeds; displayed in a quart sealer jar)
- 2. Corsage- no artificial leaves, must include corsage pin
- 3. Dried flower arrangement (for table)
- 4. Miniature display no larger than 7.5 cm
- 5. Old fashioned bouquet- favourite flowers without mechanical/artificial aids
- 6. Old fashioned tea party arrangement in a cup & saucer
- 7. Open novelty arrangement incorporating Bench Show theme; 2019 Safety: At Home, Work and Play; 2020 Dogs: Our Best Friends

Guidelines:

- (a) Important Judging Standards for both fruits & vegetables are quality, condition, uniformity, size, trueness to type & colour
- (b) Peas, beans, tomatoes, squash, apples, berries should be shown with stems EXCEPT where otherwise stated (i.e. saskatoons, blueberries)
- (c) Collections of vegetables or fruits to be displayed with the EXACT number specified on a small, uncovered paper plate or container. No GLASS or METAL containers and NO PLASTIC BAGS
- (d) Carrots, garlic, onions, beets etc., must be free of soil, trimmed 1 - 2.5 cm tops & roots lightly trimmed
- (e) Outer skins of onions must be dried, intact & NOT removed
- (f) NAME variety of vegetable or fruit on the entry tag if known
- (g) Entries may be generated from either seeds or seedlings

SECTION 7A - VEGETABLES

Class

- 1. Beans, green snap, 5 pods, uniform size & shape, no blemishes
- 2. Beans, variety other than green snap or wax, 5 pods, uniform size & shape, no blemishes
- 3. Beans, wax, 5 pods, uniform size, shape, no blemishes
- 4. Beets, globe or round, 3 roots stems & roots trimmed to approx. 5 cm long
- 5. Beets, long or cylindrical, 3 roots stems & roots trimmed to approx. 5 cm long
- 6. Carrots, 15 cm & over, 3 roots
- 7. Carrots (gourmet, purple, etc.), 3 roots
- 8. Carrots, intermediate under 15 cm, 3 roots

- 9. Chard, Swiss, complete plant with root trimmed to a conical point
- 10. Cucumbers, slicing, 1, at least 15 cm long
- 11. Cucumbers, pickling, 3, same variety, 5 12 cm long, uniform, good colour, stem attached
- 12. Garlic, 3 bulbs, uniform shape & colour
- 13. Herbs, 5 or more, labelled
- 14. Onions, 3 of same variety, uniform colour shape & maturity
- 15. Peas, (edible/sugar snap), any variety, 5 pods, uniform in size & shape, small under-developed ovules, stem & calyx on
- 16. Peas, (shelling type), any variety, 5 pods, uniform in size & shape, stem & calyx on
- 17. Peppers, 3, stems on, uniform, firm thick flesh
- Potatoes, any colour skin other than in classes 19, 20 & 21; 3, clean, uniform in size, free of disease
- 19. Potatoes, red skin; any variety, 3, clean, uniform in size, free of disease
- 20. Potatoes, russet or netted skin, 3, clean, uniform in size, free of disease
- 21. Potatoes, white skin, 3, clean, uniform in size, free of disease
- 22. Pumpkin, 1, stem attached, free of blemishes
- 23. Rhubarb, 5 stems, 2.5 cm webbing leaf blade, stem end not cut
